

GENERAL INFORMATION

All campers and sponsors are required to have a completed liability waiver.

Arrival: Teen camp will begin on Monday, July 1. Please attempt to book flights that will arrive well before this time.

Departure: Teen camp ends on Friday, July 5.

What to bring: Bible, bedding, pillow, towels, toiletries, digital camera, swimsuit, sports clothes for activities, nice casual clothes for morning and afternoon services, at least one old pair of tennis shoes, and about \$10-\$20 for spending money.

Do not bring: Alcoholic beverages, drugs, tobacco or cigarettes of

any kind, fireworks, ammunition, guns, weapons, drones, magazines, apparel with inappropriate graphics or lettering. Campers should not have cell phones, smart watches, or any other type of media device (excluding digital cameras) while participating in the camp program.

Ladies/Girls Dress: Clothing should be loose-fitting and come at least to the knee. We ask that women do not wear pants during the camp program. Please do not wear low necklines or narrow, sleeveless /tank tops. Girls may wear shorts down to the knee for athletic activities and informal services. For evening services, we ask that ladies wear nice, modest skirts or culottes. Please avoid athletic clothing for the evening services. For water activities, please wear dark shirts and shorts down to the knee over swimwear.

Men/Boys Dress: Clothing should be loose-fitting and come at least to the knee. Please do not wear gaping tank tops. Boys may wear shorts down to the knee for athletic activities and informal services. For evening services, we ask that boys wear collared shirts and nice pants (e.g. jeans or khakis). Please avoid athletic clothing for the evening services. For water activities, please wear dark shirts and shorts/swim trunks down to the knee.

Oceanview Camp reserves the right to ask anyone to change his or her outfit if, in the estimation of the staff, it does not comply with these standards.

Lost and found: Lost items not requested in 30 days will be disposed of or given away.

Camp nurso: A nurse will be present at Oceanview Camp to care for medical needs. Special instructions will be given at camp for those taking medications. For the protection of the campers, we are unable to retain campers with contagious conditions such as chickenpox or lice.

Meals: All meals are included in the price of the camp program. Those on special diets must bring their own necessary supplements.

Airport arrivals: Saipan has one airport that is about 15-20 minutes away from the Eucon campus. Eucon would be happy to provide transportation to and from the airport to the Eucon campus.

Late arrival: If you need to arrive at a later date after the camp program begins, please notify Eucon as soon as possible by contacting Ryan Kliewer the camp director at rkliewer@eucon.edu.
